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**For patients having a routine, annual or cataract eye exam: (please check one)**

- Dilated Exam:** Drops are used to enlarge the pupil, allowing the doctor to see a better, complete view of the retina and to assess for cataracts and other eye diseases. The drops will cause light sensitivity and blurred vision, especially up close, for approximately four to five hours.
  
- Enhanced Possible Non-Dilated Exam:** An optomap is a fast, painless, and comfortable digital imaging of the retina. The optomap provides a wide view allowing your doctor to confirm your retinal health or discover signs of abnormalities. It provides a permanent record of your retina that can be compared and/or reviewed at next year's exam. If the optomap does not show any signs of abnormalities and you, the patient, do not have any new signs, symptoms or complaints, drops may not be required. If the Dr. sees or suspects any questionable abnormality you may still need to be dilated. Optomap is an additional \$39 which is not covered by insurance and will be collected prior to the exam or when leaving the clinic.
  
- Enhanced Dilated Exam with Optomap:** If you have a known eye disease optomap can be performed as a way for the Doctor to follow any disease progression. If you have cataracts optomap is able to image through the cataract and allowing the doctor to visualize more of the back of your eye than with other technology. I understand insurance does not cover a screening optomap yet I choose to pay the 39.00 for a screening image.
